Dear Client:

On February 20, 2015 the New York State Senate passed, with near-unanimous approval, Bill S2486-2015 which **“Delays until March 27, 2016, the requirement that prescribers use electronic prescriptions.”** On February 25, 2015 the New York State Assembly passed the same with near unanimous approval. Details can be viewed at <http://open.nysenate.gov/legislation/bill/S2486-2015>. The bill now awaits the governor’s signature and its approval is a near-certainty.

Our company, Reliable Health Systems, LLC, (“RHS”) will therefore not be insisting that our clients implement dual-authentication for physicians by March 27, 2015. Instead the full EPCS requirements will be phased in over the next few month so that every facility will be fully implemented well-prior to March 27, 2016.

If your facility has signed with RHS and has not yet implemented CPOE (Computer assisted Physician Order Entry) for ePrescribing, RHS will contact your facility to set up an implementation schedule for **full** CPOE (and eMAR, if licensed).
